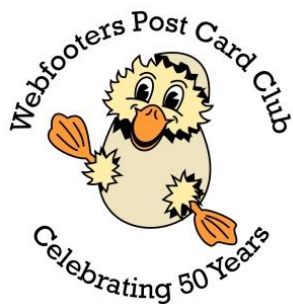

- 2) 49 MOTEL, HOTEL & COMMERCIAL ESTABLISHMENT POSTCARDS. Standard-sized litho., linen and chrome cards from Middle and Eastern U.S. States.**
- 3) 25 MOTEL, HOTEL & COMMERCIAL ESTABLISHMENT POSTCARDS. Standard-sized litho., linen and chrome cards from Western U.S. States**
- 4) 58 DIFFERENT CAT POSTCARDS. 26 of them are Continental-sized and 2 of the standard-sized cards are by Mainzer.**
- 5) 41 DIFFERENT DOG POSTCARDS. 21 of them are standard-sized chrome cards.**
- 6) APPROXIMATELY 90 VARIOUS STATES & VARIOUS COUNTRIES QSL CARDS. Dating from 1924 through the 1960s, each of the cards from Midwest and West Coast States, and from Japan, Czechoslovakia, Guam, U.S.S.R. or other countries, contains extensive hand written notes.**
- 7) RARE WEBFOOTERS POSTCARD CLUB 30TH ANNIVERSARY POSTCARD, signed by four Charter members of the Club: Bob Potts, Doris Brockell, Thelma Bengs & Al Armstrong.**
- 8) 12 -- 1960s "ANIMAL WHIMSEY" POSTCARDS BY MAURICE DAY. Day was the illustrator of many Disney creations, including "Dumbo," and was a prolific sculptor. Nine of the cards are unposted.**
- 9) 21 BEAR POSTCARDS: 7 VERY NICE "DAYS OF THE WEEK" REPRODUCTION POSTCARDS + 7 foreign, Continental-sized postcards depicting occupational bears (diver, space-bear, etc.) + 6 'real bear' postcards and 1 giant teddy bear postcard.**
- 10) 19 ROSIE O'NEILL "KEWPIE DOLL" REPRODUCTION POSTCARDS. Some duplication in lot.**
- 11) 11 ASSORTED GREETINGS POSTCARDS (2 are artist-signed), including Santa in an airship + 1 "Black Americana" NPC (non-postcard) birthday greeting.**

12) 19 ASSORTED VINTAGE VALENTINE CARDS, including several 'mechanical and/or fold-out type greetings.

13) 6 ASSORTED VINTAGE VALENTINE CARDS. Two are stand-up sports-themed cards and two are very colorful fold-out cards; one of these depicts toy soldiers.

14) 43 numbered (of a 45-card set) BERNARD GUNTHER POSTCARDS from 1974, ILLUSTRATED BY CORITA KENT. Gunther was an early pioneer at the Esalen Institute in Big Sur, California and collaborated with Joseph Campbell, Alan Watts, (BaBa) Ram Das and others. Sister Mary Corita Kent was a Catholic nun whose artwork included messages of love and peace. Her work included the 1985 U.S. "LOVE" postage stamp.

15) AUGUST 18, 1900 "HARPER'S BAZAR" ('a weekly magazine for women') MAGAZINE. Tightly-bound, with some foxing to cover edges, the very clean pages include well-illustrated articles on 'Women of the Bible-Eve,' early woman 'Surf Heroines' (rescuers), 16 pages of vintage fashions, and many other subjects. Lots of interesting advertisements.

16) OCTOBER, 1883 "HARPER'S NEW MONTHLY MAGAZINE." Tightly-bound, with some chipping, staining and tears to its covers and some pages, the magazine contains articles on George Washington, James Buchanan, horse breeding farms of Kentucky, Dalecarlia (in Sweden), as well as well-illustrated fictional stories and advertisements.

17) 3 VINTAGE MENUS, one each from San Francisco (French cuisine-featuring "Roast European Wild Boar"), New York (2-egg omelet-\$1) and Chicago(featuring ice cream and various 25-cent beer). The first two menus are clean and the Chicago menu, with two inserts, has been folded and exhibits some staining.

18) 2 PHOTO ETCHINGS ON SILK. One ("Grandcourt and Gwendolyn at the Archery Tournament") is from a painting by H. Winthrop Pierce of an illustration from George Eliot's (AKA Mary Ann Evans/Cross) "Deronda" and the second ("Fedalma Dancing") is of a drawing by William Ladd Taylor from George Eliot's "Spanish Gypsy."

19) 50 LITHO., LINEN AND CHROME POSTCARDS FROM VA, MD, R.I., PA, MASS, N.Y. AND TENN. All standard-size, they depict street scenes, buildings, roadway and water scenes. Very Good condition.

20) JUNE 1938 SOFTBOUND BOOKLET: "NEW ROCHELLE-TWO HUNDRED AND FIFTY YEARS." The large format, well-illustrated booklet with 64 interior pages, is a comprehensive history and a program for the 10-day celebration of the Huguenot area in New York State. Tightly bound and very smooth with generally very clean pages. There are areas of foxing to the front and back covers and on or near the edges of some interior pages.

21) SEPTEMBER 1946 "THE RING" -"World's Foremost Boxing Magazine." Full of illustrations, news and stories of fighters in the ring (including Joe Louis). Tightly-bound with some light cover soiling and soft bending at the magazine's upper right corner.

22) 1962 SUMMER ISSUE OF "FREDRICK'S OF HOLLYWOOD" CATALOG. Includes tasteful depictions of lingerie, swim-wear, and glamorous dresses for the woman who is "Going Places." Six full-color pages are included amongst the 48 numbered pages. Tightly-bound with some chipping and short tears (one tape repair) to the covers and to a few pages.

23) 46 FOREIGN PHOTO, LITHO., LINEN AND CHROME POSTCARDS. Locations include: Canada, Australia, Mexico, Japan, Siam, and Chile, among other countries. All cards are Very Good to Excellent condition.

24) 50 POSTCARDS FROM IOWA, MINN., IND., WISC., OHIO, N.H., MO., OK., TEXAS, the CAROLINAS and LOUISIANA. All card types are represented (RP, Litho., Linen and Chrome). Very Good to Excellent condition.

25) 7 IDENTICAL MONTANA PANORAMA VINTAGE POSTCARDS: "Hell Gate Canyon, Gateway to Missoula." All are clean and show various amounts of corner wear.

26) 44 WESTERN STATES POSTCARDS: included are 6 Great Northern Railroad litho. cards from Washington, as well as other litho., linen and chrome cards from Oregon, California, Wyoming, Utah, and other states.

27) FRAMED, VINTAGE MECHANICAL VALENTINE CARD: Depicts a romantic couple in a rowboat with oars operated by a pull tab. Very colorful and Very Good overall condition, with some creasing and bends to its lower corners.

28) ASSORTED ENTERTAINMENT PUBLICATIONS-THEATRICAL & MUSICAL: The Playbill'-Martin Beck Theatre, Selwyn Theatre (N.Y.) program, Chicago Civic Opera, vintage "Hit Parade" magazine, 14 pieces of sheet music (including Midler, Mahalia Jackson and others) and a JULY 1935 "STAGE" Magazine. The latter includes articles by Amelia Earhart, William Saroyan, Moss Hart, Clarence Day and many others.

29) 40 SLEEVED VINTAGE MAGAZINE ADVERTISEMENTS featuring CARS, MISC. ACCESSORIES AND OTHER MODES OF TRANSPORTATION.

30) 49 SLEAVED VINTAGE MAGAZINE ADVERTISEMENTS FEATURING HOUSEHOLD APPLIANCES, FOOD AND BEVERAGE PRODUCTS, PAINT AND FASHION.

31) HARD-BOUND BOOK- "SHANIKO PEOPLE," SIGNED BY AUTHOR HELEN GUYTON REES. FIRST EDITION-1983-published by Binford and Mort of Portland. The book chronicles the history and people of the pioneer community of Shaniko in southern Wasco County, Oregon. Tight, clean copy with some rubbing to covers. Signed by the author on the title page.

32) LARGE QUANTITY OF VINTAGE MONEY depicted on LARGE FORMAT POSTCARDS. Includes images of some early American States (So. Carolina, Connecticut, Louisiana) and Foreign (Ecuador, Mexico, China, & other) currency. Denominations range from \$1 to 5 million Marks. NOT LEGAL TENDER.

33) 4 PORTLAND ROSE FESTIVAL RPPCS (19-teens to 1950) + 1 DOZEN 1940S FESTIVAL SNAPSHOTS taken inside Civic Stadium. RPPCs are Very Good condition w/some corner wear. Snapshot images have variable resolution.

34) 1911 RPPC-hand captioned-"CORNELIUS LOOKING EAST." Postally used, this Oregon post card is smooth (no bends nor creases) and exhibits minor corner wear and a bit of ink smudging on the front.

35) 2 PORTLAND, OREGON RPPCs from 1915. One shows the Liberty Bell in a photo by Woodruff & Raymond and the second one is captioned "The Liberty Bell in Portland. July 15, 1915." Photo by Cross & Dimmitt. Both cards exhibit light corner, edge and surface wear.

36) 4 OREGON POSTCARDS, including 3 RPPCs: #29 "Polk County Courthouse, Dallas, Ore.;" an uncaptioned-Bridge on Oregon Coast Highway; WA (Wesley Andrews) #13 NELSCOTT AUTO CAMP (with Shell gas station). All 3 exhibit some corner and/or edge wear. The 4th card is a lithograph, unposted postcard in Fine condition: "A Merry Christmas And A Happy New Year From Oregon City." Published by Pacific Novelty.

37) OREGON STATE EPHEMERA: Modern PCs and covers; 2 MARK HATFIELD "Our Oregon Statesman" decals; Vintage "Fred Meyer" comical shopping list; Blank Greeting cards; "Mt. Hood Railroad" brochure & postcard; "The House of Mystery" brochure (stained); & a 1938 "1st Annual Oregon Intercollegiate Championship Tournament" program with team rosters.

38) PORTLAND POSTCARDS--3 RPPCS: Cross & Dimmitt "643 Shrine Hospital For Crippled Children," ELLIS 6529 "Harbor Blvd. Willamette River" & CHRISTIAN "Hospital Providence" (w/creases and bends)... And 3 Lithograph: "Prancer- Santa Claus and his Reindeer-Oregon Journal" (NPC), "U.S. 508-Portland Hotel" & "Portland Stock Yards" (w/bends & creases). Four of the items are VG or better.

39) 2 VANCOUVER, WASHINGTON LITHOGRAPHED POSTCARDS: "First Airship at Vancouver, Wash."-Good condition with some wear. "Ferry Landing at Vancouver, Wash." - Very Good condition with very minimal wear.

40) WASHINGTON STATE EPHEMERA: "Alfalfa" (DPO 2) 1909 postmarked PC; Vintage Decal-"Central Washington State College-WILDCATS"; 1929 "Seattle Grade Club Magazine-Official Organ of the Seattle Teacher's Club"; Tacoma Little Theatre Program-"Harvey"; Vintage "IVAR'S Clam Digger Room" Menu; & a Christmas 1941 "98th Field Artillery Battalion-Fort Lewis" Calendar.

- 41) **SOFT-BOUND BOOK: "Fares, Please! Those Portland Trolley Years"** by John T. Labbe. Copyright 1980-2nd printing 1982. Fine.
- 42) **SOFT-BOUND BOOK: "PICTURE POSTCARDS IN THE UNITED STATES 1893-1918,"** by Dorothy B. Ryan. Copyright 1982. A well-illustrated exploration of many postcard subjects and the hobby itself. There are 16 full-color pages.
- 43) **SOFT-BOUND BOOK: "PICTURE POSTCARD CATALOG"** by BERNHARD. A Comprehensive catalog of German Postcards with text in English, French and German. Gruss Aus, Santa and other Greetings, Historical buildings and people, Military, and a hundred other topics are portrayed. A tight and clean copy.
- 44) **"AMERICA'S LEADING PHOTOGRAPHERS PRESENT -AMERICA'S MOST BEAUTIFUL AND LARGEST SELECTION of NATURAL COLOR STOCK POST CARDS PUBLISHED by DEXTER."** A HB catalog of the publisher's 1960 inventory of post cards. Hundreds of chrome postcards are displayed under a myriad of categories. Clean; with damage to some of the plastic spiral card-retainers.
- 45) **"POSTCARD COLLECTOR MAGAZINE"-VOLUME 1. NO. 1 (NOV. 1983) through VOL. 10 NO. 12 (DECEMBER 1992).** Complete set of 110 issues of the first 9 + years of this prominent and early postcard collecting magazine. Very nice condition...just one issue with the back cover missing.
- 46) **"PICTURE POST CARD MONTHLY": 28 ISSUES-Incomplete years from 1980-1987** of this British publication for collectors worldwide. Included is the "1980 Annual" issue.
- 47) **46 different modern (1970s forward) DISNEY POSTCARDS,** including very attractive reproductions of some of the early Disney comic covers and film posters.
- 48) **RARE 1960s DISNEY POSTCARD (G-4)** depicting Donald Duck enjoying the new Submarine Ride at Disneyland. Card has an animated panel attached to the standard-size card. According to "The Nickel Tour," Disney sold this card at the short-lived ART CORNER store and created one 4-card set of postcards having animated panels attached. This is an ORIGINAL card (reproductions exist) and is # 0575 in "The Nickel Tour" book. Card is smooth, with some corner & edge wear and a bit of spotting on the backside.
- 49) **1 SET (Circa. early 1900s) OF 24 POST CARDS: "AMERICA'S FAMOUS MEN."** Depicted are: Theodore Roosevelt, Samuel Morse, Mark Twain, Robert Perry, Cyrus West Field and 19 others. With the exception of the Dewy card, which has a dye-spot/bleed along its left edge (a manufacturing flaw?). Ten cards in this boxed set have attractive American Flag borders. Box exhibits wear.
- 50) **70 ISSUES OF "PICTURE POST CARD MONTHLY" MAGAZINE.** There are just 2 issues missing (March 1988 & July 1990) in this run from 1988 through 1993. A British publication for collectors worldwide.

- 51) 1905 HB BOOK: "GLIMPSES OF THE LEWIS & CLARK EXPOSITION AND THE GOLDEN WEST." "Classic Gems and Realistic Scenes." An extensive portrayal, with descriptive illustrations and a multi-colored fold-out map, of the event that put Portland, Oregon on the map. Book is in near Excellent condition.**
- 52) 148 DIFFERENT, 1990s-early 2000s, RACK CARDS from Go-card, Tower, Max and Hot Stamp. Produced as "a new type of advertising aimed at young adults with high disposable income," these cards cover a wide range of products and services, oftentimes using unique graphics.**
- 53) 75 New "ULTRA-PRO" 2-POCKET PAGES in a binder. Useful for archival protection of a wide variety of postcards and ephemera.**
- 54) 13-INCH TALL, STANDUP CARDBOARD ADVERTISING ITEM: "Janitrol Heating-Make Your Home Comfortable." Has some soiling and wear but displays very well.**
- 55) AN INTERESTING ASSORTMENT OF EPHEMERA -Approx. 2 dozen pieces: included are odd postcards (RPs and other types), photos, Victorian scrap, 2 'Weber Bread' advertisements and a colorful "Thanksgiving Greeting" from Western Union.'**
- 56) 2 Oregon Artist PAUL KELLER (1902-1976) PORTLAND PRINTS-"The Corbett Home" (#18) & "Chinatown" (#2) + A 1962 "Agency Lithograph Company" Calendar featuring a NEWMAN Myrah (1921-2010) illustration of the sternwheeler "Bailey Gatzert." Fine Condition, except for some bending at the lower right corner to the calendar.**
- 57) A Large cardboard poster: "JOHN M. WHITELAW-CITIZEN OF THE WEEK"- Sponsored by "PORTLAND TRACTION COMPANY." Printed in 1944. Whitelaw arrived in Oregon in 1937, the same year that President Roosevelt came to Oregon to dedicate Timberline Lodge (a New Deal project). He was a tireless advocate for social programs benefitting citizens living in communities of Oregon after the New Deal years. Item has been 'pinned up' and has various-sized holes, two of them are within areas with scrapes.**
- 58) 11 early 1950s LIFE Magazines + 1 1948 LOOK Magazine ("Brooklyn Dodgers -A 50-year Album") with BASEBALL articles &/or photos. Also, a folder of loose baseball articles (Incl. Babe Ruth, Dizzy Dean, Casey Stengel, etc.) from vintage magazines. Condition is "As-Found," baseball articles/photos are present, but some magazines might be missing some page(s).**
- 59) 44-PAGE BOOKLET of ADVERTISEMENTS (circa. early 1900s) titled "ORPHEUM CIRCUIT NEWS AND PROGRAMS." Listed on the 1st page are the "Circuit of Vaudeville Theatres," including the Helig in Portland, Oregon. There are many B/W advertisements in the booklet, and a "Message to Our Patrons' from a New Orleans theatre manager. Some wear and wrinkling to covers.**

- 60) SOFT-BOUND BOOK: "THE PENNY POST 1680-1918."** From an online description: "An authoritative account of the growth of Britain's Penny Post, originally published in 1964, this book is illustrated throughout with black and white images of cards, stamps, documents, and correspondence. (It is) as much a social history as a philatelic one." A tight and clean copy.
- 61) "SUNRISE GREETINGS" booklet (circa. 1890s) BY "THE ARTISTIC LITHOGRAPHIC CO. OF LONDON."** Printed in Munich, this near Excellent (some spotting to cover and some pages) booklet has both full-size and Victorian style 'cut-out' illustrations shown in muted colors. Poems are by Milton, Longfellow and others.
- 62) 1890s-early 1900s ADVERTISEMENT for "Chase & Sanborn's 'Seal Brand' Coffee"..."For sale By Jackman & Sargent." "Served Exclusively At The World's Fair."** Heavy paper item is very colorful and exhibits some wear.
- 63) 80 AIR AND SPACE-TRAVEL POSTCARDS + 6 ADVERTISEMENTS FOR THE "SPACE CENTER ELECTRONIC MAP" at Kennedy Space Center.** Included in this group are airliner, airplane and space exploration postcards, including several very colorful Fruit Label postcards with air travel themes. Approx. 30 cards are standard-sized.
- 64) Misc. PCs & Covers: 1882 Omaha National Bank; 1st Day-Civil War & others; 1984 Post Office Centennials; Boeing; Shenandoah Blimp; 1940 N.Y. to Cuba 1st Voyage Mail: 1984 Republican National Convention", et al. Condition varies.**
- 65) SOFT-BOUND BOOK: "UNITED STATES POST OFFICES-VOLUME III-THE UPPER MIDWEST."** Printed in 1999-Compiled by Richard W. Helbock. Included are complete listings of post offices (with dates of operation & scarcity ratings) in Illinois, Iowa, Michigan, Minnesota and Wisconsin. Some wrinkling to lower part of back cover and the book's pages.
- 66) Estimated 750-1,000 gently used MYLAR POSTCARD SLEEVES.** For archival protection of standard-size postcards and small items of ephemera.
- 67) 11 Litho. MIDWEST POSTCARDS: Main Street in Independence, Kansas; various Ohio & Michigan. Very Good condition w/corner wear.**
- 68) 10 Litho. CONNECTICUT postcards: Sperry Lighthouse & Various New Haven, New Britain and Fair Haven. Corporations and misc. buildings. Very Good condition with corner wear.**
- 69) 6 Litho. FRANKLIN & ERIE, Pennsylvania postcards + 1 Rhode Island and 1 Florida Postcard. Minor corner wear. A total of 8 postcards.**
- 70) 5 Litho. CHAUTAUQUA, New York postcards + 7 Litho. PCs: Long Island & other New York + 1 N.J "Life Saver" Postcard. Some corner wear.**


71) 15 packs of 100 each: 3 3/4 x 5 3/4-inch PC Soft Sleeves. "New-Old Stock." Not Ultra-Pro.

72) 2 Issues from 1919 of "THE ILLUSTRATED REVIEW" from Atascadero, California. Each magazine has 32 pages (including covers) and has interesting content: some brutal WW I images (and photos of Dirigibles), cute pets and many fashionable women from that time period. Condition is Very Good, with a very small amount of light staining.

73) September, 1948 magazine: "ESQUIRE-THE MAGAZINE FOR MEN." With 140 numbered pages (missing sheet numbered 83-84), it has some interesting content (a Frenchman opines that "Your women, they are much too spoiled.") and it does contain the very 'tame' centerfold of 'Kitty'-"The Esquire Girl," by pin-up artist Al Moore. There is an extensive look at "Esquire's Back to Campus Design..." Magazine is well-bound and has some light staining/soiling to covers, with some mustiness.

74) January 1943 "FORTUNE" magazine. Two hundred plus pages of content heavily focused on WWII: "Hunger Spreads Over Europe," "The Second A.E.F.-A Portfolio," "Chewing Gum Is A Wartime Material," Etc.; the WWII theme continues within the extensive advertising. As is often seen with this particular Issue, the "WORLD ISLAND-A FORTUNE MAP," an un-numbered insert, is missing. A tight copy with wear at the top and bottom of the spine.

75) April 11, 1942 issue of "THE ILLUSTRATED LONDON NEWS-The War Completely and Exclusively Illustrated." The dust-cover of the magazine is loose and pages are separated; has some soiling and edge tears; but the magazine is clean, with some rusting to the staples. Content includes: a Portrait of President Roosevelt, a pictorial of women workers in the War-Time Steel Industry, "Nazi Germany In the Making," "R.A.F. American Fighters," Etc.
