2	THREE B.B. BAKOWSKI RPPCs: No. 2921: "Cline Falls, Deschutes River, Oregon." RPO Postmark 1911, light corner and surface wear; No. 2326: "Twin Tunnel Saddle Point, Deschutes River." Postmark 1912, some front side splatter staining and very light corner/edge wear; No. 3525: "Crater Lake, Oregon." Postmark 1910, photo development irregularity, message and PM embossing to front side, staining and scribbling on back side.
3	PHILATELIC Lot: (A) "Dec. 1911" cover, "Montague Oregon" (DPO 5) cancellation. Enclosed is daughter's wedding invitation from Mr. & Mrs. L.C. Montague, postmaster at that time. (B) "May 14, 1914" cover "Boyd, Oregon" (DPO 1) cancellation. Enclosed letter from local school teacher. (C) Very Poor condition "Fulton, Oregon" (DPO 5) cover (stamp missing) with penciled partial message dated March 22, 1891, written on inside of envelope. Cancellation is Feb. 14, 1891. (D) June 7, 1933 "GRACE LINE: Maiden Voyage" cover sent from Columbia (stamp). (E) One "The Mail in Switzerland" 1910 Swiss PC and one 1907 Mexico PC, both illustrated with postage stamp images.

Fine condition.
42	13 EARLY 1900s advertising items for the F.E. MEYERS & BRO. COMPANY. Included are a 1928 Catalog, a cover letter and 1903 invoice; 2 opening hat-shaped ads for Pumps-Water Systems-Hay Tools-Door Hangers; 3 Trade cards; 2 ink blotters; an 1894-dated Postcard, and a 1913 Advertisement from "The American Thresherman."

The 9th item is a 14 1/2" cut-out of a woman and her dog, with "Buckeye" on her basket. It has a small amount of wrinkling.
44	An 1894, 7 1/2" x 9" WALTER A. WOOD calendar with an idyllic rural scene with inserts depicting equipment (hay rake, side cutter, sickle-bar, etc.) of the "Walter A. Wood Mowing & Reaping Machine Company." Back side is clean and only the corners exhibit some wear and short bends/creasing.
45	A 1904, 7 1/2" x 10" "HEYDT BAKERY CO." (ST. LOUIS, U.S.A.) CALENDAR depicting a blond-tressed young woman in a halo of flowers. "A Duplicate Of This Calendar Will Be Mailed Upon Receipt Of Ten Cents In Postage Stamps By Heydt Bakery Co., St. Louis." (That is \$2.73 in 2019 dollars.) Very Fine condition with very sporadic edge wear. Back side is free of remnants.
46	FRUIT BOX LABELS: 10 full-color labels, 9 of which are from Washington State (a few show edge or corner chipping) and 1 is from Oregon (exhibits tears and creasing). PLUS 22 different, text-only, labels from "The Burrell Investment Co." of Colfax WA and "The Burrell Orchard Co." of Medford OR. Approx. half of these pear and apple labels have been folded vertically and all exhibit some light bends and/or soft wrinkles.

The movie program (a 1925 silent war drama film) exhibits wear and soiling.

50	A 6" x 6" colorful OREGON TILE featuring various locations in the State. "WALES—Made in Japan."
51	A 1925 "PORTLAND ABSTRACT OF TITLE" from the "Western Abstract Co., 314 Failing Building, Portland, Oregon." "Lot numbered 5 in Block 231." This more than 100-page Abstract begins with a reference to an 1845 Deed transferring the property from A.L. Lovejoy to Benjamin Stark. Many prominent Portlanders are mentioned in 125 years of transactions. Fine condition, with some finger-smudges from its use.
52	1933 OREGON LEGISLATURE "Cartoons by Murray Wade From The Capitol Journal" (37 <sup>th</sup> Assembly). More than 24 black & white cartoons. Fine condition, with some light soiling to cover. Also in this lot is a vintage English Postcard portraying a cartoonish scene reminiscent of some of the social issues faced by today's politicians and citizens.
53	1948 PORTLAND "LUCKY" BEAVERS baseball team illustration. Approx. 10" x 18" with 2 vertical folds & some staining to its front side.
54	1926 "Report on THOMAS-FOSTER MINE, Baker City, Oregon" by Wm. W. Elmer-Consulting Mining Engineer, Portland, Oregon. The report covers many geologic, transportation and other topics in the Eastern Oregon Copper Belt. It has 3 maps and 2 photographs (including 1 of a log cabin "Occupied by Mr. Thomas"). Also included in this lot are a used 1925 mining stock certificate: "1000 shares" in "The Independent Lead Mines, Limited" of Mullan, Idaho, and a 1910 letter certifying stock ownership in the "Big Divide Mining Company" of Wallace, Idaho.
55	FOOTBALL PROGRAMS: 1 Nov. 6 1955 "official program" Los Angeles Rams vs. San Francisco 49ers. Vertical fold, torn lower left-hand corner and erased penciling on front side. No writing on inside pages. PLUS: 20 programs with ALHAMBRA CA vs. various other H.S. football teams. All have a vertical fold and some inked notes on inside pages or covers.
56	10 issues (1910-1914) of "THE FRA" ("A Journal of Affirmation") published by ELBERT HUBBARD. All have a plethora of Roycroft articles, products and ads. All magazines have edge chipping, and a few have staining, to their covers. One magazine has a bug hole in its back cover. Inside pages are Clean.
57	VALENTINES: Dozens of vintage cards of various types, including Mechanical. Some are unused.

PLUS—an assortment of lumber-related photographs, including sawmills, logging sites, shipping and some of the executives in the industry. Included are photos of "McCormick – Lines" ships, "Owen-Oregon Lumber Co." and "Deer Park Lumber Co." Condition varies.
66	16 STEREO-VIEWS: Russian Battleship, General Meade statue, Palestine, Italy and various people subjects. PLUS—5 "Stereo World" magazines in Fine condition (1985-1996). Some of the stereo-cards have bends or soiling.
67	1905 PORTLAND FIRE DEPARTMENT Souvenir HB book – "Published in the interests of The Firemen's Relief Fund." Contains many photos of individual firemen, station houses and local Advertisements. Condition is ROUGH (edge "chipping," and some pages have bends/creases). The soiled covers are loose, and there is no spine. Still, it is a rare, informative look into the early days of the Fire Department.
68	Pictorial Atlas illustrating "THE SPANISH –AMERICAN WAR." Copyright 1898; with 150 original illustrations and "Full & Accurate Maps." Covers are loose and book lacks a spine. Inside pages are clean, with legible knowledge of everything one needs to know about this 19 <sup>th</sup> century war. Valuable even its present distressed condition.
69	"CLASS & INDUSTRIAL MARKETING" November & December 1927 issues containing interesting business articles ("New Standard Oil Contract Stimulates Initiative of Station Owners" et al.) and illustrations, including many Advertisements. Both issues are tightly bound, with some soiling and a scrape to the cover of one magazine.

81	<p><b>THE ROOSEVELT BEARS:</b> The teddy bear was invented in honor of President Theodore Roosevelt and his compassion towards a bear he encountered while hunting. Included: 6 original pages from a 1907 publication about the bears; 7 reproduction postcards from 1984; 9 clay composition figurine sets, designed by April Whitcomb and distributed in 1992 that depicts the bears in various venues (circus, Central Park, fighting fires, etc.) Fragile figures—a couple have very minor damage to a small accessory.</p>
