We held our 42nd Antique Paper Round-Up at Lloyd Center on September 19-20, 2025 and all indications were that it was a successful show. We had over 80 dealer tables of postcards, stamps, souvenirs and antique paper collectibles with dealers coming from California, Washington and Oregon. It is estimated that we saw 150 to 200 attendees at our show this year.

Antique paper shows give us that rare feeling of comraderie and the opportunity to meet people from around the region who share a like-mind. It is a real treat to see people who attend our show from year to year who share our passion for collecting and preserving historic images. We welcomed eight new members while our dealers reported strong sales and expressed their satisfaction.

We welcomed Janet Luty, granddaughter of pioneer postcard publisher and world-famous Oregon cartoonist, Murray Wade, who joined us to sell the Wade family collection of postcards, photos, sketches, books and magazines that he published from the 1800s to 1960. At the Lewis & Clark Exposition in 1905, he created many cartoon postcards promoting Oregon to attendees at the World's Fair.




