








"At Your Service", Charles H. Derrie delivered Butter, Eggs & Cheese from the Hazelwood Creamery. Early in the 20th Century, Portland was home to several prominent dairies. The Hoffman family, owners of the Hazelwood Creamery, decided to market their ice cream and other dairy products through their own Cream Stores.



The first Hazelwood Confectionery and Restaurant opened at 388 Washington about 1907. "The Hazelwood", which is shown decorated for Halloween, became one of Portland's premier Confectioneries (Cross & Dimmitt Photo Post Card).




This menu from 1924 shows three post card views of their locations.

You could listen to the Hazelwood Orchestra at the Washington Street Hazelwood each evening during dinner and after theater hours. Under the direction of J.F.N. Colburn, the Orchestra played eight or ten songs each night. The Hazelwood became a very popular place so they opened the Broadway Hazelwood which was located a few blocks away at 127 Broadway at Washington in the Morgan Building. In 1916, they opened the Multnomah Hazelwood, a remotely located Drive-in Ice Cream Parlor at Multnomah Falls. They added a Dairy Store at 126 Tenth Street and they opened the Hazelwood Confectionery Eastside at 240 E Broadway at Wheeler Street. The Hollywood Hazelwood Store was located at 1184 Sandy at 41st and the Hazelwood Ice Cream Company was located at 427 E Main Street.

The original Multnomah Hazelwood ("Temporary Building"), complete with post cards and souvenirs, was built in 1916 and it was replaced with a larger building (shown on page 5) in 1919 that stood until 1924.

As the nation headed into the Great Depression, the once successful Hazelwood empire began to shrink. The last Hazelwood Store closed in 1932. Shortly thereafter, Jim Kelly opened a Prestigious Supper Club in the former Broadway Hazelwood Store and he named it "Kelly's Restaurant" where you could eat dinner for \$1. He hired a Dance Band for nightly dancing from 9:30 pm to 1 am and an orchestra played on Sunday evenings. After five years, Kelly's Restaurant closed in 1937.

Jolly Joan, which was advertised as the "Largest Eating Place in Oregon", was located at 515 Broadway, which was across the street from Kelly's. You could choose breakfast, lunch or dinner, 24 hours a day at Jolly Joan's Counter Service. Jolly Joan had become very popular and they outgrew their space.

Wanting to accommodate more loyal patrons, Jolly Joan's Modern Dining Room opened in the former Kelly's Restaurant space. The Dining Room served wonderful dinners for 45 cents. They served a hearty lunch as well. Jolly Joan's was concerned about the comfort of their patrons so they furnished the entire restaurant with very comfortable booths which had "deeply cushioned seats to allow the maximum enjoyment of the superlative food."

Board Meeting Minutes

The attendees at the January 15, 2007 Webfooters board meeting, held at Elmer's Restaurant, were: Mark Moore (President), Al Powers (Treasurer), Jane Burton (Member-at-Large) and her son David, Phyllis Palmer (Member-at-Large), David Sell (Membership Chair), and Dave Elston (Secretary). After a call to order at 6:37 PM the minutes of the previous meeting were approved as published.

Report of Standing Committees

Financial Report – Not Available.

Membership – David Sell reported that there are 231 members listed on the roster. The board agreed that 5 or 6 members who are in arrears with their dues payments, and who have had 4 separate reminder notices sent inside the newsletters, should be dropped from the active member roles.

Refreshments – Jane Burton volunteered to provide refreshments at the January 20th regular meeting. The refreshment signup list for 2007 is relatively blank. Please remember to sign up to bring refreshments to one of the meetings. You will be reimbursed for up to \$25 in expenses (receipts should be submitted to the treasurer).

Nominating – As new board members will be needed to replace several current members who are retiring from their roles at year's end, the board discussed potential candidates and how members might be encouraged to volunteer for a stint on the board (The use of Medieval persuasion devices was dismissed as ineffective).

Annual Show – Mark reported that dealers committed to taking part in the annual Webfooters April 2007 show have paid rent for 32 tables. Tables are still available for rent at \$65 each. A separate bank account has been established by The Club for handling finances associated with the upcoming April Auction-Banquet and the PC Show. Financial activity associated with these events will be recorded using a computer software program. We plan to convert The Club's regular checking account to this system as well.

Website – The website (www.thewebfooters.com) has recently been updated to include information on the April Auction-Banquet and the Postcard Show.

Business Arising From Previous Meetings

Membership Cards and Roster – David Sell passed out prototypes he had made of 4-inch x 6-inch Club membership cards. He reported that the paper stock he used for the cards would cost approx. \$12-\$15 per hundred and that the ink to print the cards would run an additional \$50-\$100. The new Club Roster and the membership cards may be ready for distribution in February.

Library Trust Fund/\$10 Challenge – It was reported that \$144 has been raised to date for the Library Fund Challenge. Binding of a complete set of Webfooters Newsletters (1966-2006) will cost about \$325. Volumes will be bound only after all of the consecutive issues to be bound together have been located.

New Business

Club Cards For Sale – The possibility of purchasing new boxes of 20-cent club cards was discussed. Stock is running low and the sales of club cards have covered the cost of the monthly meeting site rent during the last two years. The secretary (who is charged with keeping the club cards on orderly display at the meetings), or any other board member can accept and will welcome any donations of postcards to the club.

Al Powers shared several recent newspaper articles concerning activities (none of which involved criminal matters) of Webfooters members and made them available for inclusion in the archives. He also reported that he and his wife Lois had recently attended the Doris Brockell Memorial.

After announcing that the next board meeting would be held March 12, Mark adjourned the meeting at 7:45 PM.
