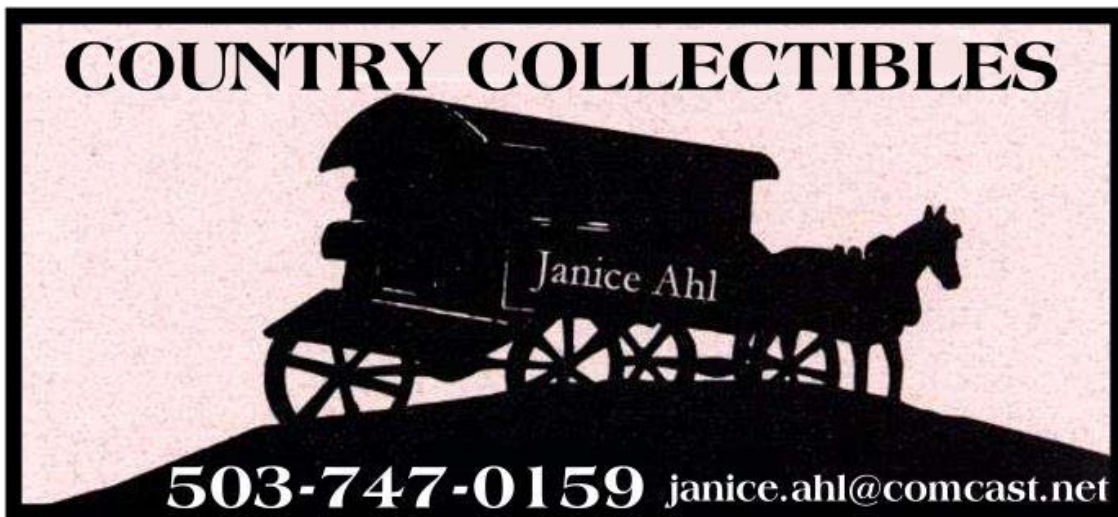

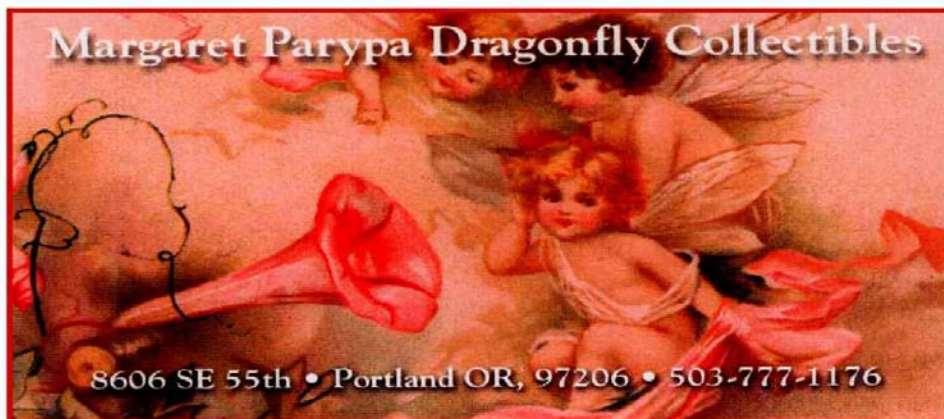

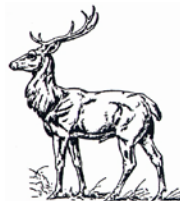

Mark's Memo

Thanks to everyone who participated in our 31st Annual Show and Sale, one of the most fun shows that I can remember. Thanks especially to those who helped make it such a great success. I predict that it will be remembered as a very successful show. With over 200 attendees, we saw attendance increase to levels of 4 to 5 years ago! There were times on Saturday when the aisles were so packed you couldn't move very easily because of the crowd.

We started Saturday with 15 early admissions and ended the day with over 150 paid attendees. Sunday, our attendance more than doubled from last year, probably our best Sunday ever. We had 45 dealer tables, the usual amount. Personally, I found some wonderful treasures to add to my collection. Attendance at the auction was up from the two previous years as well.



Karolyn “Zuzu” Grimes, who starred in the Christmas movie classic *It's A Wonderful Life* as Zuzu Bailey, was a big hit at our Show. She starred as the daughter of George and Mary Bailey, who were played by Jimmy Stewart and Donna Reed.

Our main purpose for holding these events is to educate and inform the general public about deltiology and the preservation of historic ephemera. We try to raise money to supplement our treasury and to sustain our activities throughout the year. Last year, we broke even and this year we ended up in the black with a net profit of \$367. Income for the show and auction was \$6,184 and expenses came to \$5,816.

This was a year of many challenges and we want to recognize Glenn Mason for his generous donation of time and talent in organizing and preparing the lots for our auction. This is the fifth year that Glenn has organized our auctions. Our replacement auctioneer had a medical emergency and could not attend. We want to give a word of appreciation and thanks also to Dave Torretta for filling in at the last minute.

The total for all auction lot sales was \$2,949. Payouts to consignors totaled \$2,164.35 and consignment fees to the Club totaled \$784.65. The total bill for dinners was \$900 and it was decided last year that the Club would cover \$5 of the \$20 meal cost. This worked out to \$225 that the Club paid for the Banquet, a very reasonable cost for such a wonderful event.

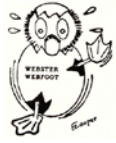
